

EXCLUSION OF STUDENTS FROM SCHOOL FOR ILLNESS

A student may be excluded from the classroom when they exhibit symptoms of a contagious or communicable illness. The school nurse is responsible for determining whether a student should be excluded from school for such an illness.

Exclusions based upon hazards other than contagious or communicable disease may only occur with the approval of the Superintendent.

Parents will be notified if their child is excluded from school for such an illness and provided with criteria for readmission.

If a student is disabled under the Individuals with Disabilities Act (IDEA), the New Hampshire RSA 186-C, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, the Americans with Disabilities Act, or any other law providing special rights to any child with a disability as defined in Ed1102.01(t), those laws shall govern and shall supersede this policy to the extent this policy may be inconsistent with those laws.
