LONG TERM SUSPENSION OR STUDENT EXPULSION

The Superintendent is authorized to expel pupils from school for misconduct, providing that where there is a suspension lasting beyond five school days, the parent or guardian has the right to appeal any such suspension to the local School Board in writing. Any suspension to continue beyond twenty school days must be approved by the local School Board. Any pupil may be dismissed from school by the local School Board for misconduct or for neglect or refusal to conform to the reasonable rules of the school and said pupil shall not attend school until restored by the School Board. Any dismissal must be subject to review if requested prior to the start of each school year and further, any parent or guardian has the right to appeal any such dismissal by the local School Board to the State Board of Education.

No student who has been expelled shall be readmitted until the student and parents have had a meeting with the Administration.
