Make sure it is a pocket folder and not a binder. A binder will be too big! Be sure that it has your name clearly written on the outside of it. I look forward to seeing your COOL folder.

Tools for home are an excellent idea. You and your grown-ups should find a place at home to be your special first grade workplace. It could be in your room, at a table, or wherever your grown-ups think best. This spot should have crayons, pencils, markers, glue, scissors, and lined and blank paper for you to show your grown-ups all you are learning in grade 1.
